Training Committee Agenda The Grove, Boise, Idaho Regular Scheduled Meeting December 8th, 2015

Meeting called to order by Sheriff Klingler, Chairman

New Sheriff School- Sheriff Klingler, Chairman

A subcommittee was formed to plan the curriculum for the 40 hour training mandatory for persons elected as sheriff. Undersheriffs/Deputy Chiefs and Jail Administrators are encouraged to attend. As a result, ISA will need to charge a more for the school to cover the costs. The school will be held at the Boise Riverside Hotel. Joint Meeting with ICOPA- Vaughn Killeen, Executive Director

This session is the first in some time in years that ISA has had a joint session with ICOPA. Committee discussed and plans to continue to meet annually, in December, coordinating training and facilitate open discussion topics.

Detention Officer Training –Tammara Slater, Programs Manager

Cassia County hosted training in November, 25 students graduated. Next training is schedule for January 11th-14th in Idaho Falls, hosted by Bonneville County. Registrations were low but are now picking up.

POST – Rebecca Sarver

Due to copyright issues, POST is unable to use the medication delivery training curriculum. The committee discussed alternative training. Many agencies are sending staff to community colleges offering medication delivery courses. Other options include having medical staff comes in to distribute medication. However, most agencies would not be able to afford this option. ICRMP Carl Ericson advised documentation of medical distribution is essential in fighting liability claims.

Training in CPR does not equal certification. The requirement of CPR certification in Jail Standards needs to be reworded. Becky from POST will work with Cindy Malm to the revision.

Civil School Report – Sheriff Klingler, Chairman
