### **Training Committee Schedule Meeting, February 2, 2015**

Chairman Sheriff Klingler called the meeting to order. Sheriff May motioned to approve the minutes from December 8, 2014. Sheriff Bunn seconded the motion. Minutes approved.

#### Civil School-Chairman Sheriff Klingler

The 2015 Civil School will be held at the Bonneville County Sheriff's Office April 21<sup>st</sup>, 22<sup>nd</sup> and half day on the 23<sup>rd</sup>. Information about the school was sent out and is also available on the ISA website.

#### Investigator Training- Cindy Malm

Specific investigator sexual assault in confinement is needed to meet IPREA/PREA standards. A two and half day curriculum of the necessary training is available on the National PREA website. The training is also available via a three (3) hour online course which enables participants to attend on their own and print off a certificate of completion after passing a competency test.

Jail Administrator, Darren Ward stated, pending discussion with Sheriff Donahue, Canyon County could host the training and provide a trainer, Detective Becker.

Sheriff Nielson motioned that the 3 hour course be the minimum standard, Sheriff Bunn seconded the motion.

#### Western State Sheriffs- Sheriff Wolfinger

Conference March 22-25, a link was sent out via the listserve for registration.

#### Conference Training Topics/Continued Discussion-Sheriffs Nielsen and Ellis

*Joint Training with Prosecutors Update*- Sheriffs continues to have discussion with their prosecutors regarding joint training. Sheriff Nielson will be contacting the IPAA President to provide training topic ideas to be shared on their listserve.

*High Profile Cases Update*- Sheriff Alexander contacted a facilitator at the FBI Academy. The facilitator now works for a private consulting firm resulting in higher costs to bring him to the conference in June.

*Sheriffs Experience Sharing*- Sheriff Nielson will be presenting at the Summer Conference on a murder committed by two 16 year old males.

Sheriff Ellis spoke about Restorative Justice Conferences, specifically one he was involved in which was recorded and is being used by the Juvenile DOC for training purposes.

Survey Training Topics- Vaughn Killeen, Ex. Dir.

This year's summer conference will provide 10 to 12 POST credit hours. Following is a list of topics provided by Sheriffs: labor laws, sovereign citizens, competitive employment, ICRMP, public records, financial/embezzlement, strategic planning, elected officials relations, impact of neighboring states legalizing marijuana, press releases, ICRMP's four red flags in standards, and using social media.

Sheriff Wolfing has taught a media course in the past. Sheriffs discussed the benefit of meeting with local news reporters. Mike Kane will provide presentation on ADA. ISA has reached out to BJA for training and technical assistance specific to employee issues: (including but not limited to) retention, motivation and release of high risk staff.

Undersheriff/Chief Deputy Training: Chairman Klingler

At this time separate training will not be provided as they need the same information Sheriffs receive. The committee will reconsider if specific training needs are identified.

POST -Chairman Klingler

Sheriffs Rolland and Anderson are stepping down from the subcommittee. Sheriffs on the POST Council will provide updates and address issues for the Sheriffs.

JusticeXchange/Offender Watch/IPREA- Tammara Slater

Training announcements will be going out this week.

*JusticeXchange* will be discussed further in operations committee. Sheriffs are encouraged to have staff attend trainings.

*Offender Watch* training is scheduled for Monday, March 2 in Lewiston. Regional training in other areas and webinars are TBA.

*IPREA* monthly educational conference calls will begin next month.

Marine Deputy Certification- Sheriff Goetz

Sheriff Nielson will take certification information to POST.

Transition Patrol/Detention Training-Committee discussion

Legislation was proposed to redefine detention officers so there would be no need to attend a transition academy. POST was not in agreement however agreed to allow Sheriffs to steer the academy. Jail Administrators Ward, Hughes and Bybee will work with Cindy Malm on the curriculum.

Under 100 Officer Training- Vaughn Killeen, Ex. Dir.

ICRMP is supporting and funding multiple training topics which will help to reduce law enforcement injury and death.
