General Session Minutes Sun Valley Inn, Sun Valley, Idaho Regular Schedule Meeting, June 1-3, 2015

Monday, June 1st 4:15 – 5:00 pm

Open Discussion - Sheriff Goetz, President

Sheriff Wilde introduced and invited the body to welcome new Jefferson County Sheriff Steve Anderson.

Commission and Board Vacancies - Sheriff Goetz, President

Membership was advised of soon to be vacated positions: Idaho Criminal Justice Commission, POST Council and ILETS.

- ICJC. The BOD advised membership that they are recommending Sheriff Wilde to the Idaho Criminal Justice Commission
- POST Council. Membership voted between Sheriff Huff and Gough for the vacant POST Counsel position being vacated by Sheriff Raney due to his retirement. Membership selected Sheriff Gough
- ILETS Board. Sheriff Snarr nominated and selected by membership.

Tuesday, June 2nd General Session 1:30 – 5:00 pm

Todd Krautkremer previewed the Idaho Chaplain Program. He works with Bonner County and he will assist with setting up a program in any county.

Sheriff Kieran Donahue spoke about the Man-Up Crusade which is a program that promotes awareness regarding violence against women. He along with his wife, focus on finding sponsors who help promote the program at rodeos throughout the West. He asked that ISA endorse the program. A vote to endorse the program was taken the following day during general discussion-it passed.

Director's Report – Vaughn Killeen, Executive Director

Executive Director provided the same report to membership as provided at the Board of Director's meeting. See minutes of the May 31, 2015 BOD meeting.

Dispatch Training- Executive Director contacted POST administrator McCraw and

advised him of association's motion to assume responsibility over dispatch training. McCraw was not agreeable to the motion and was surprised by our action. He said POST would like to continue with dispatch training recognizing that they must resolve financial issues to continue the training. Executive Director committed to McCraw that the association would not do anything further regarding the motion until we hear from POST.

Emergency Communication Technology Group – This group agreed on a proposal to draft legislation that will merge ECC and SIEC. The proposal is available on our password protected website page. Legislation will be drafted following the guidelines set forth in the agreed upon proposal and will be available for review in August-September.

Legislative Review – Mike Kane, Lobbyist

It is anticipated the following items will be legislative issues the Sheriffs should be aware of next session. No motions were made at this time.

- Knife restrictions – discussion not favorable to support but no motion made.
- Gun restrictions for felons – discussion to support legislation prohibiting felons of certain crimes from obtaining a concealed weapons permit.
- Bounty Hunter requirements – membership desires to see legislation proposed that they can support. At this point we will wait and see Aladdin Bail Bonds proposal before making further decisions.
- Violent Offender Registry – We supported this concept last session, however it was held in lieu of a tiered sex offender registry bill that also failed.
- Garnishments – will be another issue during the upcoming legislation session

Western State Sheriff Association (WSSA) – Sheriffs Dave Brown and Jim Pond WSSA representatives requested ISA join the WSSA. The Association is working on issues regarding marijuana, 2nd Amendment, Tribal and immigration issues.

- 2016 Summer Conference – membership voted to hold conference in Coeur d'Alene.
